The Sermon on the Mount is the greatest sermon ever recorded in the history of mankind. It is within this message that Jesus Christ gives basic marching orders to every one of His followers as to what it means to live a life that glorifies and honors the Lord. As we come to an end of the Sermon, Jesus gives one final message comparing the wise and foolish builders who choose to live life according to God's Word or reject it and experience a life in ruin. The primary mark of wisdom that Jesus examines is a life that is built upon the solid foundation of the Word of God while the primary mark of the foolish is the one who overcomplicates life with busyness and ends up building his/her life upon worldly philosophies and meaningless pursuits. Max Lucado observes,

"Busyness is an expert in robbing the sparkle and replacing it with the drab. Busyness invented the yawn and put the hum in the humdrum. The strategy of busyness is deceptive. With the passing of time, he'll infiltrate your heart with fatigue and cover the cross with dust so you'll be safely out of reach of change. Busyness won't steal your life from you. He'll do something far worse. He'll paint it with the familiar coat of drabness. The poison of busyness will blind your eyesight to the wonder of the cross."
